Welcome to Lake Chinook Fire and Rescue's fire protection district. As a new property owner within or protection district we would like to welcome you and your family to the area and share some important fire and emergency medical information with you.

Call 9-1-1:

In the event of a Fire or Medical Emergency, **Call 9-1-1**. Since most people only have cell phone access, please indicate to the 9-1-1 operator you are in Jefferson County, Lake Chinook fire district.

Know Your Location:

Please be sure that your new property has a green or red address sign adjacent to your driveway. If you do not have a 9-1-1 address sign or location marker, please contact the fire district office.

Mark down your new address and tape it to your back of your front door or on your refrigerator. We want you to be able to tell us where you are in the case of an emergency.

Subscribe to Air Ambulance Service:

In the case of a serious medical condition or a trauma, Lake Chinook Fire & Rescue will generally utilize an air ambulance for transport to St. Charles Bend, the area's trauma center. This type of ambulance can be very expensive, so we encourage everyone to subscribe to Air Life, Airlink, and JCEMS ambulance FireMed insurance. Outdoor Burning & Fire Restrictions:

All outdoor burning, including campfires, burn barrels, propane camp fires and debris burning require an **Outdoor Burning Permit** by law. Propane camp fire units must be registered and approved by the fire district. These permits are available by contacting the fire district office. Failure to obtain a permit may result in fines and penalties. Approved Burn Barrels are available at the Fire station for \$15.00. Before any outdoor burning activity, you are required to call the outdoor burning information line at 541-410-5077. All current fire restriction will be listed. Fire season generally begins in June and runs through October. During this period, **ALL OUTDOOR BURNING IS PROHIBITED! Please see website for details.**
